
































Officer's Report =

2017 was another highly successful year for the Long Island Housing Partnership (LIHP) with approximately 1,850 clients assisted through various initiatives and programs. In 2017, LIHP's newly formed Community Land Trust made significant progress on the pre development work for the rebuilding of 23 Superstorm Sandy damaged homes across Nassau and Suffolk Counties. This work will allow the demolition and subsequent construction of new homes to start in 2018.

At LIHP's 29th Annual Meeting, RuthAnne Visnauskas, the Commissioner and CEO of New York State Homes and Community Renewal provided the Keynote Address. RuthAnne took her time to speak about working with great partners like LIHP. She also talked about the new funding options for the creation of affordable/workforce housing in New York State. LIHP also had several clients attend and speak on behalf of LIHP's programs that they have benefited from.

LIHP continued to secure low cost capital for its lending arm the Long Island Housing Partnership Community Development Financial Institution (LIHPCDFI). The LIHPCDFI now has secured \$3 million in capital through three different lines of credit, which will help in creating low-interest loans for predevelopment and construction of affordable housing on Long Island.

LIHP's Education programs, including Pre-Purchase and Foreclosure Prevention counseling continued to assist clients purchase housing and help homeowners stay in their homes across Long Island.

In 2017, LIHP served approximately 1,000 clients through these education programs.

LIHP continues to build and assist in the creation of new affordable homeownership and rental housing. LIHP continues working on many ownership and rental programs across both Nassau and Suffolk Counties, with the continued focus on downtowns and transitoriented development. In 2017, LIHP assisted over 500 households through its Technical Assistance programs.

The Employer Assisted Housing Program continues to be a very successful Economic Development program for Long Island companies and their employees. In 2017, over 55 households were able to purchase and rehabilitate their homes through this program.

The Fair Housing education initiative continued with LIHP sponsoring and coordinating a conference to discuss Fair Housing issues affecting the LGBTQ community. LIHP also developed and presented a comprehensive fair housing training for Realtors in collaboration with the Long Island Board of Realtors.

The Long Island Housing Partnership is very grateful for the support and participation of our Board of Directors, members, funding sources and Government partners. Without you, our programs and successes would not be possible.



After running for the United States Senate in 1988 and winning editorial "praise" from "The New York Times", Mr. McMillan was named by President George Bush to the Board of the Panama Canal Commission and confirmed by the United States Senate for the post on November 19, 1989. On October 27, 1993, Mr. McMillan was elected Chairman of the Commission's Board of Directors—the first person who was not an official of the Department of Defense to serve as Chairman.

He also served as an Assistant to Richard M. Nixon, as Counsel to U.S. Senator Kenneth B. Keating where he was directly involved in the Cuban Missiles Crisis, and in a wide range of assignments as a Corporate Officer of Avon Products, Inc, including the Asia Pacific Profit Center. Mr. McMillan has also served as a member of the Board of Trustees of the American Medical Association for six years, the first non-physician to serve on that Board, and he was a Member of the Board of Directors of Madison National Bank from 2007 - 2012. He also served on the Board of Directors of WellChoice, Inc. from 1994 through 2005 and on the Board of Lumex, Inc. from 1984 to 1997.

In 1987, Mr. McMillan founded the Long Island Housing Partnership, Inc. and served as its Chairman until 2001. The Partnership is the first suburban coalition in the United States of business, banking, labor, religious organizations and institutions of higher learning to build and facilitate the construction of affordable housing.

Mr. McMillan co-hosted Face-Off for over fourteen years. A PBS television show, Face-Off was seen throughout the metropolitan New York and Albany areas. In addition he has provided political commentary on Cable Television over MSNBC, CNN, and Fox.

Occasionally, he has written columns for "Newsday", the "Miami Herald" and "The New York Times". In addition, he has written two books, "Global Passage—Transformation of Panama and the Panama Canal" and "Columns: Marilyn Monroe to Vietnam and Iraq".

Finally, Mr. McMillan finished first in his class at Ft. Belvoir's Engineer Officers Candidate School and served in Korea with an Engineer Combat Company. First Lieutenant McMillan was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for his service in Korea.



Jim Morgo is currently President of Morgo Private Public Strategies, a private-sector consulting business that specializes in municipal approvals and community acceptance.

Mr. Morgo was Suffolk County's Chief Deputy County Executive from November, 2007 to April, 2009. He was "second in command" of the ninth largest County in the United States with 900 square miles and a population of 1.5 million people. In this capacity, Mr. Morgo had direct oversight of all county departments consisting of more than 12,000 employees and a \$2.6 billion budget. He came to Suffolk County as its first Commissioner of Economic Development and Workforce Housing in September 2004. As Commissioner he served as the Chief Administrator of the five division department (aviation; cultural arts and film; community development; affordable housing; and economic development) with the mission to attract, retain and expand businesses in Suffolk County and to allow needed workers to find homes they could afford. He also served as Chair of the Suffolk County Industrial Development Agency until 2012.


Mr. Morgo served as the Long Island Housing Partnership's first President and Chief Executive Officer for nearly seventeen (17) years. He transformed the Housing Partnership from a start-up organization of two employees with an annual budget of \$160,000, to the Long Island region's preeminent housing organization and the most well-respected suburban housing group in the nation. When Mr. Morgo left the Housing Partnership, it employed eighteen (18), had six

(6) affiliate organizations and had annual budgets ranging between \$10 million and \$30 million.

Mr. Morgo taught English for three years to junior and senior high school students at Cranwell Preparatory in Lenox, Massachusetts and for fourteen years at Bayport-Blue Point High School. He also taught English as an adjunct instructor at Nassau Community College, Suffolk Community College and Dowling College.

In 1983, Mr. Morgo was elected to represent the Eighth Legislative District in the Suffolk County Legislature. As a Legislator, he sponsored landmark legislation calling for a public acquisition of the Long Island Lighting Company, and he established himself as a strong advocate for middle-class homeownership.

NEWSDAY named Jim Morgo as one of the ten Long Island Residential Real Estate "Movers and Shakers." In 2005, he was named by the Long Island Business News as one of Long Island's 100 most influential leaders. In 2005, 2006 and 2007 the Long Island Press named Jim Morgo one of Long Island's 50 most powerful leaders. He has received many awards from civic, community and business organizations for his leadership in housing and business. Mr. Morgo holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Boston College and a Master of Arts degree from Columbia University and a professional leadership certificate from the John F. Kennedy School of Government of Harvard University.





Charlie and his wife Barbara reside in Huntington, New York. They have two married daughters and three grandchildren.







From 1987 on, through his service to the Housing Partnership, Howard acted on his idealistic belief in helping others without







The North Amityville program, which is being chaired by Msgr. Hartman, will involve 70 two-bedroom townhouses which will sell for under \$65,000, Mr. Morgo said, and in Hempstead village, "our only pro-gram in Nassau County to date," sev-

The partnership is also exploring the possibility of starting a lending consortium which, Mr. McMillan ex-plained at the meeting, would "make available a pool of funds to facilitate development" of housing. Such a pool would "diversify he lenders," he said, noting that there is often a "besitation" on the part of "individue.

Mr. McMillan, a former Republican candidate for the U.S. Senate, agreed, saying that one of his "few criticisms" of the Reagan Administration was "in the area of housing."

And while "Gov. Cuomo has really stepped in," Mr. Morgo said, the governor's announced budget cuts for the coming year are also cause for onnerm. As a result of such "budget con-







- South Wind Village, 78 mixed-income homeownership and rental homes built in a downtown development to rejuvenated downtown Bay Shore, continues



- Broadway West II was started in Brentwood for a total of 42 units made up of 14 one-bedroom apartments, and 28 two-bedroom apartments affordable to families with incomes from 30% to 60% of the area median income (less than \$40,000 annually)
- In the summer of 2002, funding was secured to finance the HEMAP (Home Emergency Mortgage Assistance Program) program. HEMAP provides low-interest loans to homeowners who have not been able to keep up with mortgage payments because of job layoffs, medical emergencies or other factors








- Ten new homes were offered on a first-come, firstserved basis in the hamlet of Wyandanch, as part of the Wyandanch revitalization program


















- Ten new homes called Neighborhood Vistas I were built in the Town of Babylon. Colonial and ranch style single family homes built on scattered sites throughout Wyandanch
- ★ Islip VIII Cortland Square workforce housing community began with 40 homes offered to applicants under 120% of the area median income. Of the 40 affordable homes, 20 were offered to applicants under 80% of the median area income
- Copper Beach Village in the Village of Patchogue was launched as part of the Main Street Redevelopment workforce housing initiative. This 80 unit new construction single family development for first time homebuyers was one of the first workforce housing initiatives in Suffolk County
- LIHP worked with John Wesley Village, an affordable senior housing development located in the Town of Riverhead. LIHP worked under the terms of the Technical Assistance contract to serve as the community liaison between residents and management
- Under the Town of Southampton's "Planned Development District" zoning designation, Westhampton Pines was built in the hamlet of Westhampton. 19 homes built that were designated as affordable for sale to qualifying seniors and a ranking lottery was held.
- Under a Technical Assistance contract with national developers Archstone Smith, LIHP provided qualified applicants for the rental of 80 affordable apartments, 40 of which were allotted for seniors in Archstone Westbury
- ★ LIHP worked under a Technical Assistance contract in partnership with Nassau County and a private developer to assist in marketing 125 homes in a six story cooperative residece called Cedar Valley located in the Village of Hempstead
- A LIHP worked under a Technical Assistance contract on the marketing of 45 affordable new town homes and flats being built in the Town of Islip called Islip Landing
- The first development being constructed under the Town of Oyster Bay "Next Generation" zoning code was approved for construction by Engel Berman Beidler. The Seasons at Plainview consists of 106 homes for seniors and 28 Next Generation homes for first-time homebuyers. LIHP is working under a Technical Assistance contract with the Town of Oyster Bay to market and monitor the Next Generation homes for the Town.
- Nassau/Suffolk Partnership Housing Development Fund Company (formerly Bay Shore Partnership Housing Development Fund Company) officially incorporated August 15, 2005









- LIHP and developer James Vilardi of Roosevelt Development Corp. began constructing five affordable homes on scattered sites in the Town of Hempstead, called Phase 13.
- ↑ Under a Technical Assistance contract with Avalon Bay Communities, LIHP worked to qualify rental applicants and administer waiting lists for Avalon Court and Court North affordable rental apartments in the Town of Huntington
- A LIHP marketed and ranked applications for the eight affordable homes in the senior community of Countryview Estates in Smithtown
- Under a Technical Assistance contract with Locust LLC, LIHP adminstered the Town of Islips's affordable Senior Housing Program at Locust Cove development in Oakdale, with three affordable units
- ★ LIHP worked with Pulte Homes under a Technical Assistance contract to market and sell 51 affordable homes at the Courthouse Commons Development in the Town of Islip
- Majors Path Associates, LLC to market and sell 14 affordable units in The Courtyards with the Town of Southampton
- The Long Island State Senate Majority Delegation partnered with LIHP to secure a \$25 million grant for homeownership, called the "HELP Long Island" program. With the assistance of LIHP, employers were able to tailor the HELP Long Island Program to their specific employee recruitment and retention needs








- LIHP celebrated its 20th Anniversary
- The Islip Housing Authority and LIHP held a lottery for potential homeowners for 18 homes in Bay Shore. Homeowners were provided homebuyer and mortgage counseling
- In the summer of 2002, funding was secured to finance the HEMAP (Home Emergency Mortgage Assistance Program) program. HEMAP provided low-interest loans to homeowners who were not able to keep up with mortgage payments because of no fault of their own either through job layoffs, medical emergencies or other factors
- ★ Islip VII contained 16 scattered sites, 13 of which were completed in 2007. Home prices after subsidy range from \$129,000 - \$184,000
- ★ Islip IX planning started for nine scattered sites
- Working under the Technical Assistance contract to assist the Southampton Business Alliance Housing Initiative Corporation, Sagaponeck Woods were built and consisted of two homes, each with an accessory apartment
- A lottery was held for ten scattered sites in the Town of Riverhead. These two-story colonials and a ranch home will be sold to families earning 80% or less of the area median income
- ★ LIHP assisted Nassau County to open its new Home Ownership Center, the first of its kind on Long Island
- ★ LIHP started building 14 homes on scattered sites throughout Nassau County for families earning 80% or under of the area median income
- A lottery was held for the second Next Generation development in Massapequa in the Town of Oyster Bay, with LIHP administering the review qualification and mortgage counseling for applicants







- A 30 unit senior development, Foster Meadows in Elmont, within the Town of Hempstead is underway. HELP Phase II grants were available for homebuyers in this development
- Nassau County's Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) was launched
- Nassau County, Suffolk County and the Town of Babylon received federal NSP funds to purchase foreclosed properties, rehabilitate and resell them to buyers who earn at or below 120% area median income
- The Town of Babylon Down Payment Assistance program was launched to help families earning at or below 120% of the area median income
- The Greens at Melville was built by Kabro/Benjamin Developers, consisteing of 100 senior one-bedroom units
- The Southampton Business Alliance Housing Initiative Corporation is breaking ground on two single-family homes, each with a rental apartment in Sagaponack. with lottery and application screening and qualification process








- Construction began on five Nassau County scattered sites in Roosevelt, Uniondale, the City of Long Beach and the Village of Hempstead
- The Village of Patchogue, working with Tritec Real Estate, began development of the New Village at the Four Corners in the heart of Patchogue. The program included 67 affordable residential apartments
- LIHP worked with the Village of Patchogue and Suffolk
 County to support the innovative affordable housing concept
 for
 live/work loft rentals for artists in the Artspace Patchogue
 lofts development
- LIHP worked with the Town of Riverhead and the developers of the Summerwind mixed-use rental development, consisting of 52 affordable rental apartments, a mix of studios and one- and two-bedroom apartments
- Wyandanch Rising kicked off a comprehensive, community based revitalization effort in the Town of Babylon
- LIHP worked under a Technical Assistance agreement with the developers of Wellington Park Villas, a community located in Amityville with two-bedroom condominiums. Qualified buyers received \$25,000 in Smart Growth "HELP" grant assistance
- The Community Stabilization Program (CSP), sponsored by the NYS Republican Senate Delegation for Long Island launched. Eligible homebuyers who found a foreclosed home they wished to buy as their primary residence could receive grant funds towards the purchase of the home




- Kevin Law becomes Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors
- Inwood Partnership for New Homes program begins with four 3-bedroom homes and one two-family home with a rental apartment being built
- The last of the 14 affordable homes in the Courtyards at Southampton development closed
- LIHP worked with Nassau County and the Greater Hempstead Development Corporation to revitalize the Parkside area in the Village of Hempstead
- A LIHP established the Rehabilitation Emergency Assistance Program (REAP), to provide grants that allow Long Islanders with disabilities to stay in their homes by making accessibility improvements





- With the Town of Brookhaven, LIHP is developing ten scattered site homes in the Mastic, Mastic Beach Village and Shirley area on land donated by Suffolk County
- LIHP is in partnership with North Hempstead CDA and Cornerstone Properties to construct eleven townhomes in New Cassel. All eleven 3-bedroom townhouses will be sold to families earning less than 80% of the area median income
- ★ LIHP will be assisting in marketing and tenant eligibility for Hudson House, a 36 affordable senior apartment complex under construction by Mill Creek Residential in Mineola
- ★ LIHP assisted the developer, Marie Acquisitions with homebuyer eligibility determination and provided \$25,000 in subsidy per home through the NYS Senate HELP Program to the families purchasing 13 condominium units in the Michael Thomas Estates in Amityville
- ★ LIHP assisted in obtaining \$520,000 in subsidies and \$400,000 in NY Senate HELP funds to reduce the subsidized sales prices for 16 affordable condominium units in Wildwood Estates in Holtsville
- The walkable community known as The Meadows in Yaphank (aka The Reserve at the Boulevard) is being developed by AVR Realty in the Town of Brookhaven. 24 rental units will be reserved for households making 80% or less of the area median income
 - A LIHP became a member of the Long Island Volunteer Organization Active in Disaster (LIVOAD) group, which is comprised of municipalities, service agencies and housing providers, in order to cooperatively provide sorely needed services to those most in need in times of disaster.
 - ★ Community Development & Disaster Relief Corporation officially incorporates May 10, 2013
 - Long Island Housing Partnership Community
 Development Financial Institution officially incorporates
 November 25, 2013. The goal of LIHPCDFI is to provide
 low-cost financing options for the development of

- A LIHP worked closely with the Southampton Housing Authority and Manzi Homes East to complete ten Cape Cod style homes on tax foreclosed land that was provided by Suffolk County through the Town of Southampton with financing provided by subsidies form the New York State Affordable Housing Corporation and HUD's HOME Program with additional financial support through grant awards from Bank of America and Citi Foundation
- Spearheaded by the Town of North Hempstead Community



- Fair Housing training was provided for all LIHP staff, and added extensive fair housing information and resources to its website, incorporated fair housing in to the housing counseling curriculum and educational community meetings
- LIHP and the Long Island Board of Realtors cosponsored a conference, which included topics such as fair housing for real estate and other professionals, updates to the Suffolk County Human Rights Law and the state of fair housing in the co-operative housing sector







- Construction commenced on an adult community located in the Town of Brookhaven, The Vineyards at Blue Point. 28 units are being offered at below market prices to those households at the 80% income limit and 120% income limit. LIHP is assisting with marketing and owner eligibility
- A mixed use redevelopment by Rechler Equity, Greybarn in Amityville in the Town of Babylon began construction of its first phase. The Town of Babylon has provided for 100 of the units to be offered to families with incomes at or below 80% of the area median income. LIHP is overseeing the initial kick off of the program and administration of the workforce units into the future
- LIHP partnered with Suffolk County and The Suffolk County Land Bank to facilitate community revitalization through rehabilitating Zombie properties located in Suffolk County
- D&F Development Group, LLC broke ground on Highland Green Residence, which is the first affordable limited equity cooperative located in Melville. LIHP with assistance from both the Town of Huntington and Touro Law School is involved in outreach and education, in addition to securing NYS AHC and NYS HELP fund for the project

 Prospect Avenue offers 10 affordable rentals to households earning 50%, 60% or 80% of the area median income. LIHP is assisting with the marketing and initial lease up of the affordable units and will assist with the administration of the units going forward
- LIHP is working under the Technical Assistance contract with the builder Bartone Properties to assist with the marketing of two affordable units in The Hearthstone at Farmingdale in the Village of Farmingdale. LIHP is also assisting with securing federal HOME funds from Nassau County
- The Long Island Partnership CLT Housing Development Fund Co., Inc. (LIPCLTHDFC) was established in October of 2016. From the beginning in 1941, Long Island Builders Institute members have traditionally served on the boards and supported fund raising efforts of many of the charities on Long Island. So it was not a great leap of faith when in 2001, a handful of LIBI members came together to form an entity that had long been discussed but never acted upon and the **Long Island Home Builders Care** (LIHBC) was created.

A separate, independent tax exempt 501C3 charitable entity which accepts contributions from organizations and individuals from all walks of life, Long Island Home Builders Care has NO payroll and the organization is supported 100% by volunteers. All donations are used to further our mission; "to apply the member's construction capability to directly assist families or individuals who are otherwise unable to overcome special life challenges and to enhance community facilities which otherwise could not adequately serve such persons and to provide financial assistance to children or grandchildren of members and their employees who are planning to attend college."

Today, LIHBC continues to stay true to it's mission. After the 9/11/2001 tragedy, working together with other building organizations, members raised and contributed over \$400,000 to the victims and their families.

Through the years, among its wide-ranging community involvement, LIHBC has continued to;

- Provide home additions, renovations and repairs to assist handicapped and needy families
- Provide special needs children with customized transportation vehicles
- Contribute supplies and labor for local community projects
- Build and donate full sized children's playhouses to Long Island charities
- Build and donate animal pet houses for various animal shelters
- Annually donate food, clothing and toys for charitable holiday events
- Annually adopt a children's shelter for Christmas, donating presents and clothes to fulfill the wish list of the children and throwing them a party complete with a visit from Santa Claus

The Long Island Home Builders Care Gregory Mancini Memorial Scholarship Fund was originally created to honor a founding partner of the Park Ridge Organization who died suddenly in 1993. In 2001, Park Ridge transferred the corpus to LIHBC and to date, LIHBC has provided over \$150,000 in scholarships to students attending college through this unique annual scholarship program.

Shelter is a basic need and the members and their families who earn their livelihood in the construction industry understandably take great pride in their profession. LIHBC provides another vehicle for members to quietly "give back" to the communities they have helped to develop, continuing the founder's tradition.
